BULLS WELL RESTED FOR BATTLE ON HOMECOMING WITH BALL STATE

The University at Buffalo Bulls look to bounce back after a bye week when they host resurgent Ball State University on Homecoming weekend this Saturday at UB Stadium.

The Bulls are looking to win their second straight home game, dating back to a 20-17 win over Bowling Green on September 23, and snap a two-game losing streak.

The Cardinals of Ball State, meanwhile, come into Buffalo on a roll. Two weeks ago, Ball State snapped the nation's longest losing streak at 21 games with a 15-10 win at Miami (OH) and followed that up with an impressive 33-14 win over Eastern Michigan in Muncie last Saturday.

BULLS ON HOMECOMING

The Bulls have posted a 2-3 record during Craig Cirbus' tenure as head coach on Homecoming Day games.

HOMECOMING HARBINGER?

Ball State is no stranger to Homecoming games as it has posted back-to-back wins in those games.

The Cardinals spoiled Miami's Homecoming with their 15-10 upset win two weeks ago and then defeated Eastern Michigan 33-14 for their first home win since 1998 in front of more than 17,000 goal-post removing fans in Muncie on Saturday.

BOBCATS BOUNCE BULLS AS MISTAKES MAKES THE DIFFERENCE

Ohio University ran for 367 yards on the ground and took advantage of four Buffalo turnovers to post a 42-20 victory on October 7 at Peden Stadium.

Quarterback Dontrell Jackson rushed for 139 yards and threw a touchdown pass to lead the Bobcats (2-3, 1-2 in the MAC), who defeated Buffalo (1-5, 1-2) for the third time at Peden Stadium in the last four years.

The Bulls misfired early in the game when they had opportunities to put Ohio in a hole and never recovered. On Buffalo's first drive of the game, UB went 60 yards in 12 plays only to have a 32-yard field goal by **Scott Keller (Amherst, NY/Amherst Central)** bounce off the right upright.

Then on Ohio's first play from scrimmage, the Bobcats fumbled the ball inside of the 15-yard line and the Bulls had it in their hands only to give it back to

Ohio. The Bobcats eventually scored on their next possession before the Bulls responded.

After six straight running plays, UB quarterback **Joe Freedy (Bethel Park, PA/Bethel Park)** and split end **Andre Forde (Penfield, NY/Penfield)** continued their touchdown tradition of the last four weeks with another long score. Freedy hit Forde in stride for a 61-yard bomb to tie the score 7-7 in the first quarter. It was the fourth straight game that the two had connected for a touchdown pass and it was Forde's fifth touchdown of the season.

After the Bobcats went ahead, 21-7, the pivotal series of the game occurred.

Senior safety **Tory Smith (Centereach, NY/Half Hollow East)** intercepted a Jackson pass and returned it 48 yards to the Ohio 19 with :30 left. After a completion and penalty set the Bulls up first-and-goal at the seven, Freedy had a perfect pass for a touchdown glance off the hands of junior **Dahnel Singfield (Baltimore, MD/**

Dunbar). On the next play, Freedy was intercepted by Chris London and the Bobcats took all the momentum to the lockerroom.

That momentum stayed with Ohio in the second half as the Bulls turned it over three more times and could not make up ground despite twice stopping the Bobcats on first and goal inside the UB ten.

"Ohio was focused, well-prepared and they executed almost flawlessly and looked like the big-league football team that I saw on film," said UB coach Craig Cirbus. "Turnovers and careless plays on our part were catastrophic. We're working every day to improve them and it looked like it was worse tonight. It was as bad and ugly a football game as I've seen around here in a long time."

Freedy completed 17-of-31 passes for 262 yards and two touchdowns for the Bulls. Junior **Albert Grundy (Springfield, PA/Valley Forge JC)** had four receptions for 35 yards for the Bulls, while Forde had three catches for 85 yards and true freshman **Zeke McKine (Hollywood, FL/MacArthur)** had three catches for 75 yards.

Defensively, free safety **Craig Rohlfs (Cincinnati, OH/Moeller)** led UB with nine

tackles (eight solos) while Smith had nine tackles, one for loss, and his second interception of the season.

SCOUTING THE CARDINALS

The Cardinals of Ball State come into Buffalo on a roll after back-to-back wins have changed the outlook on a campaign that started with four straight losses – extending what was then the nation's longest losing streak.

The Cardinals have seen a resurgent running game and defense pave the way for its victories the last two weeks.

Cardinal bullet points:

- After averaging only 90.5 rushing yards per game through the first four games, Ball State's offensive line has helped the Cardinals average 205.0 yards per game in the last two contests. Last week, tailbacks **Anthony Jones** and **Marcus Merriweather** combined for 147 yards and three touchdowns.
- Defensively, the Cardinals have held their last two opponents to a combined 106 yards rushing (53.0 per game). **Lorenzo Scott**, a true freshman linebacker, led the Cards last week with eight tackles.
- Ball State has had **14** different players catch passes thus far this season with five different players accounting for the team's seven touchdown receptions.
- Quarterback **Talmadge Hill** is 2-0 as a starter after taking over for senior Brian

• MAC PEPSI PLAYERS OF THE WEEK •

Offensive Player of the Week: Thomas Hammock (Northern Illinois). Hammock ran for a MAC record-tying five touchdowns and a personal best of 174 yards in the Huskies' 52-35 win at Akron. Hammock's record-tying touchdowns came from 9, 5, 1, 15 and 34 yards and were among his 32 rushing attempts. Hammock became the first MAC back since Central Michigan's Brian Pruitt in 1994 versus Toledo to rush for five touchdowns in a game. Hammock's two third-quarter touchdowns rallied the Huskies from a 28-27 deficit to a 35-28 lead and his fourth quarter score secured the final margin.

Defensive Player of the Week: DeJuan Goulde (Toledo). Goulde led the Rockets to a 42-0 win over Marshall with seven tackles, five tackles for a loss, three sacks and a fumble return for a touchdown. Goulde's first-quarter fumble return for a touchdown from 17 yards out put the Rockets up 14-0 and gained early momentum. The shutout was the first suffered by the Herd since a 1989, 14-0, loss to UT-Chattanooga, a span of 151 games.

Special Teams Player of the Week: Kent McCullough (Miami). McCullough had his best game of the season with a 47.1 yards per kick punting average and three of five touchbacks on kickoffs. Three of his punts landed inside the BGSU 20-yard line in a 24-10 RedHawk victory. McCullough's kicking, including a 62-yard punt, aided the RedHawks in a close game that was tied at 7-7 going into the fourth quarter.



Conn two weeks ago at Miami. Hill, who has seen action in all six games, has been nothing if not exciting throwing seven touchdowns and seven interceptions on just 89 total attempts. That means that every 6.4 passes Hill has attempted this season have gone for either a touchdown or interception.

CARDINALS HAVE WON BOTH OF PREVIOUS MEETINGS

This will be the third meeting between the Bulls and Cardinals with Ball State claiming both of the other meetings in tight games.

This is the second straight meeting in Buffalo, with the Cardinals scoring a 14-7 win back in 1970, UB's last season as a major college program until last year.

QUOTABLE COACHES

Here are some excerpts from Ball State head coach Bill Lynch and UB head coach Craig Cirbus' MAC teleconferences on Monday morning.

Lynch on his team's winning streak...

"I think we're getting better as a football team. We have played for the most part without turning the ball over. Against Eastern we were able to open up a lead and hold on in the fourth quarter. It was a good win for us."

On unfamiliarity with Buffalo...

"It helps a little bit that we have games where they have played other conference opponents. That gives you a better feeling. We've seen Buffalo on tape against Marshall and Bowling Green and Ohio. I think they're extremely well-

coached and they play very, very hard. They really have competitive guys that really battle you and fly around. They play a 50 defense, and that's going to put a lot of pressure on our offensive line to block that front. They've got good balance and I really like the way their offensive line comes off the ball."

On his team turning the corner...

"I think the last couple of weeks we've been able to run the ball more effectively and that's helped us by keeping the defense off the field. We also have a lot of receivers who we feel good about, so we're spreading the ball out a little more."

Craig Cirbus on the team's bye week...

"We tried to get some fundamentals and individual work in and to work on some technique while also trying to get a jump on Ball State and what a whole different football club they are right now."

Craig Cirbus on Ball State...

"We never played Ball State last year and in all the games we watched on film last year none of the games had Ball State in there. Like the rest of the world all I knew was here's a team that has struggled in the win-loss column and

then when you see the film you realize that this is really a good, solid football team, a team that plays with a lot of enthusiasm and I say, geez, where did all these losses come from? This looks like a very good defense."

Cirbus on his team's mental state

"We had a huge win over Bowling Green a few weeks ago and that was so meaningful, as the Ball State players know. We had to jump and play Marshall the next week and we played a great first half and a tremendous physical football game. We turned around and played a real poor game against Ohio. We've got to recall those good moments of the Bowling Green game and summon that up for a Ball State team that has a lot of renewed confidence."

FORDE ON A TOUCHDOWN ROLL

Sophomore split end **Andre Forde (Penfield, NY/ Penfield)** has been on a touchdown spree matched onl twice in the last ten

years of UB football.

Forde has caught five touchdown passes in the last four games, tying him for sixth in the MAC in scoring average per game (5.0 ppg), and has gotten to the end zone in four straight games.

The only other players in the last decade to score in four straight games were **Roy Hobson** during the 1991 season and fellow split end **Jamie Gasparre** during the 1996 season.

Forde continues to show an incredible ability at getting in the end zone. In his two-year career, Forde has now caught 32 passes of which seven of them have gone for touchdowns (or one in every 4.6 receptions).

All seven of those touchdown receptions have been from quarterback **Joe Freedy** and lately the two have been dialing long distance. Freedy and Forde combined for a 72-yard score at Marshall, the longest in four years at UB, and a 61-yard TD strike at Ohio.

WILLIAMS CONTINUES TO MAKE BIG PLAY IMPACT FOR BULLS

Outside linebacker **Duane Williams (Detroit, MI/Denby)** continues to be a big-play force for the UB defense. Williams had seven tackles at Ohio, including two for losses.

The junior currently ranks second in the MAC in sacks (6) and tackles for loss (8) and ranks third on the Bulls with 32 total tackles, including 23 solo stops.

BULLS GETTING SACK HAPPY

A big reason for the Bulls' improved play in 2000 comes from their ability to get to the quarterback.

Buffalo has already posted 14 sacks this season compared to the 12 it had all of last season.

SOMETHING IN THE NUMBER 15?

Junior quarterback **Joe Freedy** is

beginning to etch his name into the UB record book and further into the lore of quarterbacks who have worn the number 15 at UB.

Freedy follows a long line of UB quarterbacks who have worn the #15, many with great results. The first was **Gordon Bukaty** (1958-60) who set the all-time offensive record with 2,493 net yards and helped UB to the Lambert Cup in 1958. His records were later rewritten by future NFL quarterback "Long" **John Stofa** (1961-63), who went on to play with the Miami Dolphins and Cincinnati Bengals.

Back in 1996, when the Bulls went 8-3 and gained their first national ranking as a Division I team (than as a I-AA entry), **Mark Taylor** led the Bulls at quarterback.

Freedy is now putting himself in those players' company as he is already among UB's career leaders in completions (T-5th, 273), yards (8th, 2,808), and touchdowns (8th, 17) as a junior.

In addition, **Freedy ranks 12th in the nation in pass completions per game (20.3 per game).**

MCKINE CONTINUES TO SHINE

True freshman flanker **Zeke McKine (Hollywood, FL/MacArthur)** has put himself into consideration for **MAC Freshman of the Year** honors.

McKine continues to lead the Bulls in receptions (26), is second in yardage (310) and has UB's top single-game total of the season with his 10 grabs vs. Connecticut (9/16) for 122 yards.

McKine currently ranks second **in the nation** among true freshmen wideouts in receptions (26) – behind Purdue's John Standeford – and ranks fourth in receiving yards per game (51.7) among true frosh.

SMITH AND SPENCER ABOUT TO BREAK TOP TEN IN TACKLES

Seniors **Carlos Spencer (Buffalo, NY/South Park)** and **Tory Smith (Centereach,**

NY/Half Hollow

East) are both about to crack the top 10 in career solo tackles.

Spencer needs three tackles to move past former All-American linebacker

Gerry Quinlivan

(who had 107 from 1981-84) while Smith, who had six solos at Ohio last week, needs just four to break the top 10.

Another defensive back – junior **Craig Rohlfis (Cincinnati, OH/Moeller)** – will enter the top 10 as well this year. Rohlfis currently has 95 solo stops after leading UB with nine tackles at Ohio, including eight solo stops.

MASUCCI MAKES HIS MARK

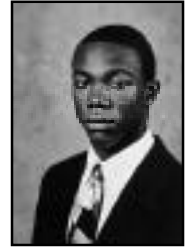
Senior punter **Mike Masucci (Syracuse, NY/Christian Brothers Academy)** has made an impression after returning to the starting lineup two weeks ago at Marshall.

Since returning, Masucci has averaged an impressive 43.6 yards per kick, including a career-long 62 yarder at Ohio. Masucci has also had four punts downed inside the 20-yard line in those two games.

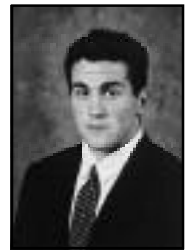
For the season, Masucci is now averaging 42.9 yards per kick. For his career, Masucci ranks second all-time in total punts (177), punting yards (6,843) and average per kick (38.7).

RUSHING TOUCHDOWNS TOUGH TO COME BY FOR BULLS

When junior running back **Albert Grundy (Springfield, PA/Valley Forge JC)** scored from four yards out at Ohio, it

marked just the second time the Bulls have scored via the ground in the 2000 season.

The Bulls have tallied just five rushing touchdowns in their last 11 games dating back to last season while throwing for 14 scores during that same time.

SIGNS OF LIFE IN RUNNING GAME

After averaging just over 50 yards per game rushing through the first five weeks, UB had its most impressive outing of the season at Ohio.

The Bulls ran for a season high 145 yards on 46 carries in the game with redshirt freshman **Marquis Dwarte (Baltimore, MD/ Perry Hall)** leading the way with 87 yards on 18 carries.

The 87 yards by Dwarte are a season high for a UB back this season and the most since **Josh Roth** ran for 114 yards at Virginia in 1999.

STATISTICAL TRENDS IN 2000

Some interesting statistical tidbits after six weeks of the 2000 season:

Third quarter blues : The Bulls are being outscored an incredible 91-0 in the third quarter thus far in 2000.

Rugged going on ground : The Bulls are averaging just 66.2 yards per game on the ground while allowing opponents to run for an average of 209.5 yards per outing.

Fourth down success: The Bulls rank second in the conference on opponent fourth down tries. Opponents have made just 2-of-12 (16.7%) on fourth down. Last year, opponents converted 8-of-15 (53%) of their tries.

Conversely, UB has converted 6-of-11 tries on fourth down (54.5%) this year.

Spreading it around: Last year, current Buffalo Bill **Drew Haddad** caught 52% of the passes the Bulls threw. This year, UB is really spreading its receivers out, with 13 players having caught passes already this year. UB's receiving leader, **Zeke McKine**, has caught 26 of UB's 122 completions (21.3%).

Getting in the backfield: Last season the Bulls recorded 67 tackles for loss for the entire season and just 12 sacks. So far in 2000, the Bulls have already registered 14 sacks and 50 tackles for loss. The Bulls are led by **Duane Williams** (eight tackles for loss) and **Chris Gray (Frewsburg, NY/ Frewsburg)**, who has seven tackles for loss.

BULLS BEST BLOCKING OFTEN TIMES ON SPECIAL TEAMS

Since Craig Cirbus' arrival at UB in 1995, the Bulls' special teams have been among the nation's best in blocking kicks.

That trend has continued this season, with UB already blocking two punts this year, and deflecting two others.

Since 1995, the Bulls have blocked 28 total kicks, including 11 in Cirbus' first season.

BULLS TRANSACTIONS

The following players need updates since the publishing of the 2000 media guide:

Three-year starter **Josh Stello (Moon Township, PA/Moon)** was lost for the season in July when he suffered a torn

ACL to his right knee. He will redshirt and return for a fifth season next year. He will most likely miss next spring's drills but should be fully recovered by next August.

Sophomore **Terrance Dawson (Warren, OH/Warren G. Harding)** joined the Bulls on Tuesday, August 14 after playing last season at City College of San Francisco.

Dawson was originally signed out of high school to play at Indiana University and played his high school ball with UB teammates **Alvin Jennings** and **Marcus Claret** at Warren G. Harding HS in Ohio.

Dawson was a two-time All-Steel Valley performer in high school and led the conference in sacks during his last two years. One scouting service had him ranked among the top 15 interior linemen in the Midwest his senior year.

Sophomore **Kyle Kampf (Long Branch, NJ/Shore Regional)** suffered a back injury the first day of pre-season drills and returned home to New Jersey. He has decided to transfer from the program.

CAPTAINS FOR WEEK SEVEN

University at Buffalo head coach Craig Cirbus announced during the first week of camp that he will name captains each week during the 2000 season and name permanent captains at the conclusion of the season.

This week he named seniors

Carlos Spencer (Buffalo, NY/South

Park), Brandon Shaughnessy (Stafford, NY/LeRoy), David Pruce (Chardon, OH/Chardon) and **Chris Gray (Frewsburg, NY/Frewsburg)** as captains for Homecoming weekend against Ball State.

BULLS SET SCHOOL RECORD FOR SACKS IN WIN OVER BG

The UB defense saw a pair of sack records fall in its first-ever MAC win against Bowling Green on Sept. 23.

Duane Williams (Detroit, MI/Denby) earned the MAC's Defensive Player of the Week award after posting a school-record four sacks, while as a team the Bulls had seven sacks in the game, another all-time best.

Williams shattered the record held by **Vince Canosa**, who had 3.5 sacks against Buffalo State on October 16, 1993.

SWITCHING JERSEYS

Because of position changes there has been one roster switch for the Bulls.

Redshirt frosh **Andy Avery (Rochester Hills, MI/Rochester Hills)** has moved to offensive tackle and switched from jersey #93 to #79. Another redshirt freshman **Lorenzo Jones (Winter Haven, FL/Lakes Region)** switched from #79 to #93.

BIRTHDAY BULL

Redshirt freshman **Lorenzo Jones (Winter Haven, FL/Lakes Region)** celebrates his 20th birthday on Tuesday, October 17th.

NEW LOOK OFFENSIVE LINE

The Bulls' offensive line has gone from the most experienced in the country in 1999 (with over 150 career starts) to perhaps the least experienced.

Senior **David Pruce (Chardon, OH/Chardon)** is the only lineman to have started a game on the offensive line heading into this season.

EXCELLING IN THE CLASSROOM

The UB football program continues to excel in the classroom as the Bulls currently have 10 players with a cumulative GPA over 3.0 and have averaged

THE COACHING MATCHUP

The Bulls are coached by Craig Cirbus (Buffalo, '80) in his sixth year as head coach after spending 11 seasons as an assistant for legendary Joe Paterno at Penn State.

Cirbus has an 18-43 career record and earned NCAA Division I-AA Independent Coach of the Year honors after leading UB to an 8-3 record in 1996 – UB's first winning season in over a decade.

Bill Lynch (Butler, '77) is in his sixth year at Ball State and his 11th season as a collegiate mentor. Lynch owns a 59-51-3 all-time record, including a 36-12-3 mark at Butler from 1985-89.

Lynch led the 1996 Cardinals to the MAC championship and a berth in the Las Vegas Bowl that same season. He came to Ball State from Indiana where he was an assistant coach in 1993 and 1994.

WHAT'S NEW IN 2000

The Bulls have plenty of new looks to them entering the 2000 season.

New helmets: The Bulls have added the University interlocking UB mark to their helmets while adding the word "Bulls" just above the face mask.

A revamped coaching staff: Particularly on the offensive side of the ball, UB will have lots of coaches in new places, if not new faces. **Charlie Donnor** remains the offensive coordinator but goes from offensive line coach to quarterbacks coach; **Tony Policare** moves from quarterbacks coach to wide receivers; second-year coach **Chris Wiesehan** goes from wide receivers to the young offen-

sive line and **Jim Gibbons**, who started his UB career in 1995 on the field, moves to running backs coach after directing the Bulls' strength and conditioning efforts the last four years. Gibbons' switch came in the wake of Dennis Greene accepting the head coaching job at Erie Community College in Buffalo, which begins football in the fall of 2001.

In addition, **Chuck Williams**, a fixture in Western New York coaching, comes to UB from Canisius College to coach the tight ends. Williams had coached UB's secondary from 1985-89.

Defensively, the changes were more minor; with **Matt Rhule** taking over the defensive line duties after spending last year as a graduate assistant, replacing **Tom Jones**, who moved back to coach the Bulls' safeties. **Mike Gebbia** remains in the secondary and will handle UB's cornerbacks. First-year graduate assistant **Doug Socha**, a North Tonawanda native, will be a defensive assistant with primary duties in the secondary.
