## TONIGHT'S GAME

### THE GAME:

Buffalo will finally get to play in their home arena, having played nine of their last 11 games away from home. It will be short-lived however as the Bulls will follow tonight's game with three straight road games, including non-conference tilts at the Big 10's Northwestern next Wednesday and at Canisius, in a rescheduled game, on Tuesday, Feb. 6th.

Since December 5th, the Bulls have played just two games at Alumni Arena – that's just two home dates in the last 53 days. Ohio, meanwhile, is coming off an impressive 91-63 win over Northern Illinois, a game that saw head coach Larry Hunter record the 500th win of his coaching career. Ohio has won five of their last six games to improve to 5-2 in the MAC, good for third place in the MAC East Division behind only Kent State (6-1) and Marshall (6-2).

### BUFFALO:

The Bulls are 2-13 and 0-8 in the MAC entering tonight's game and are in the midst of an eight-game losing streak dating back to a 74-69 win over Alcorn State on Dec. 22 at the South Florida Tournament.

The Bulls are just 1-5 at Alumni Arena this season, but have been close in every game, losing by no more than six points in any game, including a pair of overtime losses (to Canisius and Akron).

### OHIO:

The Bobcats enter Buffalo on a roll having won five of their last six. Ohio has been balanced all year with three players scoring in double figures for the season (Brandon Hunter, 16.4; Anthony Jones, 13.8; and Steve Esterkamp, 10.6). The Bobcats saw more of that in their 91-63 win over Northern Illinois as four players hit double figures, led by Esterkamp's 16 points and seven rebounds.

### THE COACHES:

**Reggie Witherspoon** is in his second season with the Bulls and is currently 2-13 this season. He has a 5-33 career record at UB after coaching most of last season on an interim basis. **Larry Hunter** is in his 25th season as a head coach and his 12th season at the helm of the Bobcats. Hunter became just the 89th coach in NCAA history to reach 500 victories with Wednesday's win over NIU. Hunter is 195-143 at Ohio and 500-219 overall.

### THE SERIES:

Ohio had dominated the series meeting between these schools, holding a 6-1 advantage. The Bobcats have won all three meetings between the teams since UB joined the MAC, winning twice in Athens, OH and once in Buffalo. Prior to UB's joining the MAC, the two teams had not met since the 1953-54 season. UB's lone win in the series came in the first-ever meeting between the two, a 41-23 victory in the 1929-30 season.

### LAST MEETING:

Ohio dominated the Bulls from start to finish in the last meeting between the two teams, winning 82-62 at UB's Alumni Arena last season. The Bobcats jumped out to an 11-3 lead and took a 43-27 lead into halftime. Sanjay Adell led Ohio with a game-high 22 points and Steve Esterkamp added 16 points. **Damien Foster** led UB with 16 points and **Louis Campbell** added 14 points.

### ON THE AIR:

Tonight's game, as are all UB men's basketball games, will be broadcast live on WWKB 1520 AM radio. Jim Rosenhaus will call all the play-by-play action for the Bulls while Rick Maloney will handle the commentary.

## BEHIND IN FREE THROWS

The Bulls are trailing their opponents in free throws by a wide margin this season. UB is 219-of-336 (.652) from the line, while UB opponents are 275-of-379 (.726) from the line, giving UB opponents a 56-point advantage from the line. In eight MAC games, its a huge disadvantage for the Bulls.

The Bulls began to change that, however, at Western Michigan as UB shot a season-high 40 free throws in the game, compared to 20 for the host Broncos. Unfortunately for Buffalo, they converted on just 63% of their shots at the charity stripe (25-of-40) in the game.

## LONG HARD ROAD TRIP

Buffalo's new nickname might be the Road Warriors this season with the long stretch of road games the team has had so far. Prior to the Ohio game on Jan. 27th, UB has played just two home games in a span of 53 days. Beginning with the Dec. 17 game at North Carolina and ending with the Feb. 6 game at Canisius, Buffalo has a stretch where 12 of 15 games are on the road. Beginning with the Dec. 16 departure for the game at UNC, the Bulls spent/will spend a total of 35 days over a 53 day period traveling on the road.

## REBOUNDING ON THE DECLINE

After being successful on the boards through most of the early part of the season, the Bulls rebounding totals have taken a turn for the worse of late. UB had a season-high 51 boards in a loss against Canisius, and going into the Northern Illinois game (Jan. 6), had a +0.9 rebounding margin over their opponents and that margin now stands at -1.3. Over a three-game span, UB totaled 24, 26 and a season-low 22 rebounds. The 22 rebounds against Central Michigan was the lowest single-game total for UB since the Bulls had 22 boards in a win over Oral Roberts Jan. 3, 1998.

## LONG RANGE RECORDS

**Damien Foster** hit seven three-pointers against Marshall, putting him in a tie for fourth place for most three's in a game with Mike Martinho and Jaime Anderson, who did it twice. Martinho has the record with 10 three-pointers in a game. As a team, UB hit 12 three-pointers against Marshall, which ranks as the third-highest total in UB history for most in a game. The record is 18 against Troy State in the 1995-96 season. Against Central Michigan, the Bulls again hit 12 three-pointers, going 12-for-25 (.480) from behind the arc.

On the season, **Foster** has hit 40 three-pointers and he is now just one away from 10th place for most three's in a single season. As a team, the Bulls have 105 three-pointers after 14 games, and are pace to break the team single season record of 183 from the 1995-96 season.

## ICE COLD FROM OUTSIDE

The Bulls, who have ranked among the conference leaders in three point field goals made per game all season have hit a mid-winter freeze from long range.

Buffalo has connected on just 11-of-49 from long range (22.4%) over their last three games, including a 3-of-17 performance at Western Michigan on Wednesday. Buffalo is still averaging 7.2 made three-pointers per game, but haven't gotten to seven in a game since hitting 12-of-25 at Central Michigan on Jan. 13th.

## STAT NOTES:

- UB's 42 points in a loss at Miami (1/20) was the lowest scoring output for Buffalo since a 106-36 loss to Iowa State to open up the 1996-97 season.
- The Bulls hit a season-low three three-pointers in a 58-52 loss to Kent State and in a 90-72 loss at Western Michigan. The season high is 12 three-pointers in the overtime loss at Marshall and in a loss at Central Michigan.
- **Robert Brown** has hit more free throws than any other UB player has attempted. Brown is 78-of-121 on the season (.645). **Louis Campbell** has the second most attempts on the team behind Brown with 68 attempts, hitting 49 of those (.721).
- **Damien Foster** has hit 63 field goals on the season, with his 41 three-pointers accounting for 65% of the field goals he has made. Of his 163 field goal attempts on the year, 107 (65.6%) of those attempts have been from behind the arc.
- The Bulls have four players averaging double figures this year, **Robert Brown** (15.7), **Damien Foster** (13.1), **Jason Robinson** (13.4) and **Louis Campbell** (12.9). After those four there is a severe dropoff as no other UB player is averaging more than four points per game.

## CAMPBELL CLOSING IN ON ASSIST RECORD

Senior **Louis Campbell** is closing in on the career assist rankings in UB's record books. Campbell had 179 assists entering this year, and currently has 62 this season, giving him 241 on his career. Campbell currently ranks sixth all-time in UB history in career assists. Ryan Peterson, a former teammate of Campbell's, is next on the list in fifth place with 278 career assists.

## UB PLAYERS NEED TO STAY BELOW 20 POINTS

This year, UB is 0-8 in games where at least one player reaches 20 or more points. UB had a player hit the 20-point mark in each of the first three games of the year, as well as against North Carolina, the first two MAC games of the year and at Bowling Green, all losses for the Bulls.

In games where no UB players reach the 20-point mark, Buffalo is 2-4. The four losses were against Eastern Illinois when **Jason Robinson** had 17 points, at Northern Illinois when two players had 13 points, at Central Michigan when two players had 18 points and against Kent State when one player had 18. In the Bulls' two wins, **Robert Brown** was the leading scorer both times, scoring 16 points against Duquesne and 18 against Alcorn State.

## IN SEARCH OF A ROAD WIN

Buffalo is still in search of its first MAC road victory as the Bulls enter their third season in the Mid-American Conference. UB went 0-9 each of its first two years in the MAC. The Bulls have been close twice this year, losing 85-75 in overtime at Marshall and 86-77 at Central Michigan, a game they trailed by two with under five minutes to play.

UB is 0-7 in all road games this season, and has not won on an opponent's home floor since an 81-78 win at New Hampshire early last season.

## BROWN NAMED ALL-TOURNAMENT



Junior **Rob Brown** was named to the USF Shootout All-Tournament team after leading the Bulls to a win over Alcorn State in the consolation game. Brown had 18 points, eight rebounds and a career-high five assists in the win over the Braves while playing on a bad ankle he twisted in the first round matchup with Eastern Illinois. Brown also had 13 points and five rebounds in the Bulls' loss to the Panthers. He hit 8-of-16 (.500) shots from the field and 15-of-22 (.682) from the line in the two games.

## UB-CANISIUS MAKEUP DATE SET FOR FEB. 6

Buffalo and Canisius will makeup their snowed out game from earlier this year on February 6, at 7 pm at the Canisius College Koessler Center. The game was scheduled for Monday, November 20 at Canisius, but was cancelled due to the bad weather and massive amounts of snow that hit the Buffalo area that day, almost leaving the Bulls stuck at the pregame meal.

## BULLS COURT REPORT

The **Bulls Court Report** TV show will feature discussions with UB men's head basketball coach Reggie Witherspoon and UB women's head coach Cheryl Dozier and will air weekly throughout the season on Adelphia HTTV. The show will feature a review of past games and a look ahead to upcoming action as well as features and stories with some of the Bulls' players.

The show will air every week on **Wednesdays at 8:30 pm, Thursdays at 8:00 pm** and then on **Fridays at 8:30 pm** on Adelphia HTTV.

## BULLS TELEVISION SCHEDULE

The University at Buffalo will have a total of six games televised this season, four nationally and two locally on Adelphia HTTV.

UB has three games as part of the MAC television package, beginning with the Feb. 3 game at Akron, followed by the Feb. 10 game with Bowling Green at UB. Both of those games will be shown on ESPN Plus and Empire Sports Network. The Feb. 12 home game with Eastern Michigan will be shown on Fox Sports Regional and Empire as part of the MAC package as well. The February 24 game against Miami will be shown locally on Adelphia HTTV. ## DOUBLE YOUR PLEASURE

This season, Buffalo has had players record a double-double on four occasions. **Robert Brown** got the first of the year in the season opener against Niagara, recording game-highs with 25 points and 13 rebounds. Against Fairleigh Dickinson, **Louis Campbell** recorded 11 points and a career-high 14 rebounds for his first double-double of the season. UB then had two players record a double-double in the overtime loss to Canisius as Campbell did it for the second time, recording a game-high 23 points and 11 rebounds. **Jason Robinson** also got into the act, recording career highs with 20 points and 13 rebounds for his first double-double of the year.

## LAWRENCE KEYS WIN OVER DUQUESNE



In UB's Dec. 5th game at Alumni Arena, junior **Davis Lawrence** was a key component of the Bulls' win over Duquesne, scoring a career-high 15 points off the bench. Lawrence scored 13 of those 15 points in the final seven minutes of the game, with his other two points coming on a buzzer-beater to end the first half. After Duquesne tied the game at 46-46, Lawrence hit a three-pointer to give UB the lead for good. The Dukes cut it back to one point but Lawrence hit a running jumper to push the lead back to three. He then converted on 8-of-10 free throws in the final three minutes of the game. Lawrence also scored the last six points for UB and eight of the team's last 11 points to help secure UB's first win of the season.

## UB HAS BEST SHOOTING NIGHT SINCE 1998

In the Bulls' season-opening loss to Niagara, UB shot a blistering 58.3% (28-of-48) from the field, including 65.2% (15-of-23) in the first half, and shot 61.5% (8-of-13) from three-point range. Last year, the highest UB shot in any game was 52.0% in a loss at Akron. The 58.3% was the highest UB had shot from the field since Feb. 3, 1998, when UB shot 62.7% (37-of-59) in a win over Rochester.

## TURNER BATTLE SIGNS WITH UB

UB got its first recruit for next year with the signing of **Turner Battle (Kennersville, NC/East Forsyth)** during the NCAA fall signing period. Battle is a highly-touted point guard who averaged 17 points, five rebounds and five assists per game as a junior while leading his team to a 15-8 conference record and a conference championship.

All-Star Sports Editor-in-Chief and college basketball recruiting expert Bob Gibbons had Battle listed as one of the top 100 prospects for the Class of 2001. "I think this is the steal of the millennium," said Gibbons. "Turner Battle could have played for an ACC school. He's a true point guard who is a tremendous floor leader and an outstanding student-athlete."

ESPN and ABC college basketball analyst Dick Vitale was even impressed with UB's signing of Battle. "(Buffalo) got a real steal in Turner Battle, who is a high school phenom from North Carolina. From everything I've heard about this kid, I think he is going to be a superstar."

### RECAP

**BUFFALO, NY-** The University at Buffalo dropped the opening game of the season to Niagara for the third straight season, falling 80-76 despite an opening game double-double by the Bulls **Robert Brown**.

Robert Brown led all scorers with 25 points and grabbed a game-high 13 rebounds for his first double-double. Daryl Greene led Niagara with 21 points and Christos DeFoudis added 15 points and eight rebounds. **Louis Campbell** had 15 points and four assists for the Bulls.

UB took a four-point lead into the halftime after a hot-shooting first half, hitting 65.2% and 5-of-8 from three-point range. The lead went back and forth early on with the largest lead of the half coming at the 8:36 mark when UB took a 27-20 advantage. Niagara would tie the game for the eighth time at 34-34 before UB closed the half with a 6-2 run.

UB would hold that lead through the first part of the second half, taking the game's largest lead of seven points at 55-48 and again at 57-50. Niagara fought back, closing the gap to just one point on two occasions before Daryl Greene tied the game at 66-66 on the first of two free throws. After missing the second free throw, Greene converted with a layup to give Niagara the lead 68-66 with 4:37 remaining. UB answered with a Campbell three-pointer and two free throws by Brown to give UB a 71-70 lead with 3:31 to play, but Niagara grabbed another offensive board and scored to give the Purple Eagles the lead 72-71. Niagara hit key free throws down the stretch, never relinquishing the lead again and held on for the 80-76 win.

UB committed 22 turnovers in the game while Niagara had just 15. The Bulls did shoot well from the field, hitting 58.3% (28-of-48) from the field and 8-of-13 (61.5%) from three-point range.

Senior **Maliso Libomi** had a career-best seven rebounds off the bench for the Bulls, who got only seven minutes from starting point guard **Gabe Cagwin** who continued to be hobbled by a bruised foot.

**TAMPA, FL** - The University at Buffalo came back from a disappointing loss in the opening round of the USF Shootout, and notched a 74-69 victory over Alcorn State in the tournament's consolation game.

UB got behind early, trailing 8-3 before a layup by **Jason Robinson** tied it at 11-11. Alcorn State would eventually stake a seven-point lead before the Bulls then went on an 8-0 run to grab the lead at 24-23. The Braves grabbed the lead back until **Damien Foster** then hit a three-pointer with 6:44 to play in the half, giving UB a lead it would not relinquish the rest of the game at 27-25, and UB took a 38-32 lead into halftime.

Alcorn State came out in the second half and made it a two-point game at 39-27 with 17:54 to play. The Bulls responded with a layup by **Robert Brown** and two free throws by Foster. Brown then had a dunk to push the lead to eight points at 45-37 with 15:58 to play. The Braves cut the lead to five points on three other occasions over the next three minutes, but each time, Robinson came up with a big shot to extend UB's lead.

The Braves would make a late charge, and slowly closed the gap to just two points, 71-69, after a three-pointer by Devon Pack. Brown would hit 3-of-4 free throws down the stretch for the 74-69 final score.

Buffalo was led by **Robert Brown**, who was named to the all-tournament team, with a game-high 18 points, eight rebounds and five assists. **Jason Robinson** had 17 points and nine rebounds for UB as well.

Marshall would take the lead back on some free throws. The game was tied again four more times in the last four minutes, the last on a jumper by **Robert Brown** with 0:50 to play and the game went to overtime tied at 68-68.

Joda Burgess hit two three-pointers in consecutive possessions for Marshall for a six point lead. UB could get no closer than two points the rest of the way, as a free throw by Foster made it a 76-74 game with two minutes to play. Marshall hit seven free throws down the stretch for the 85-75 final score.

Damien Foster had a season-high 24 points for Buffalo and six rebounds. Foster hit 7-of-11 from three-point range for the game, and his seven three-pointers tied him for the fourth-highest single game total for a UB player. The Bulls as a team hit 12 three-pointers, which tied for the third-highest single game total in UB history. Robert Brown poured in 19 points and had five rebounds and Louis Campbell had 15 points. O'Tes Alston scored five points off the bench and had a team-high seven rebounds.

Akron would close the game with a 14-3 run, limiting UB to a free throw and a layup by **Robert Brown** with two and a half minutes to play in regulation. The Bulls still held a two-point lead with a minute to go, but a steal and breakaway layup by Akron's Rashon Brown tied the game and sent it to overtime.

The first half saw both teams take nine-point leads, the first by Akron early on as the Zips led 18-9 at the 9:59 mark. At that point, the Bulls went on a 14-0 run and took a five-point lead of their own at 23-18 with 5:41 left in the half. Over that run, **Damien Foster** hit two three-pointers and Robinson scored seven points to lead the Bulls run. A layup by Foster at the 2:50 mark gave UB a nine-point lead at 31-22 and the Bulls would take a 35-27 lead going into halftime.

Jason Robinson led UB with a career-high 23 points in the loss. Damien Foster chipped in 17 points for the Bulls and Robert Brown added 15 points. Robinson also finished with a game-high seven rebounds.

## RECAP

**DeKALB, IL** - The University at Buffalo is still in search of its first MAC win after falling to Northern Illinois 64-49. The Bulls' 49 points were the lowest output of the season as UB managed just 13 field goals in the game against an aggressive NIU defense.

It was even through the first seven minutes, with three ties and three lead changes. A three-pointer by **Jason Robinson** tied the game at 10-10 with 13:26 to play in the first half, but it was all Northern Illinois after that. The Huskies took the lead for good on the next possession on a three-pointer by Mike Brown. That ignited a 10-2 Huskie run over the next four minutes as they took an eight-point lead. The Bulls would cut the lead to five points before NIU closed the first half with a 9-0 run and took a 33-19 advantage into halftime.

The second half was again dominated by NIU as the Huskie defense shut down any UB offensive charges. The closest UB came to making a run was a 6-0 spurt midway through the half. A free throw, followed by a **Damien Foster** and a fastbreak layup by **Kevin Swoffer** cut a 17-point lead down to 12 points, 49-37, with 9:41 to play. That was as close as UB would get the rest of the game as NIU responded with a bucket on the next possession and cruised to a 64-49 win.

Northern Illinois did the job on both ends of the court, shooting 51.0% (25-for-49) from the field and 56.3% (9-for-16) from three-point range. The Huskie defense limited Buffalo to just 31.7% (13-for-41) from the field and just 49 total points, the lowest point total for UB since November 27, 1999, when Canisius beat UB 78-46.

UB had just two players hit double figures as **Damien Foster** and **Jason Robinson** each had 13 points for the Bulls.

### RECAP

**OXFORD, OH** - The University at Buffalo basketball team had no answer for Miami University junior Alex Shorts in a 74-42 loss.

Shorts connected on 13-of-19 shots from the field and keyed a late first half run by the RedHawks that turned the game around as Miami kept Buffalo winless in MAC play on the season.

The Bulls kept it close throughout the first half, cutting the lead to 23-19 on a three-point jumper by **Damien Foster** with 3:49 remaining. Shorts then hit three straight mid-range jumpers, the last with :04 left in the half, that sent the hosts to halftime with a commanding 31-19 lead.

The second half opened with Miami's Jason Grunkemeyer connecting on a three-pointer and the Bulls never again cut the lead into single digits. Grunkemeyer scored 10 of his 13 points in the second half and the RedHawks turned the ball over only five times in the game compared to Buffalo's 19 miscues.

Buffalo shot just 27.3% in the second half and 34% for the game, while Miami converted 49% of their attempts (31-of-63). Due to a 34-31 rebounding edge and the huge edge in turnovers, Miami had 22 more attempts at the basket (63 to 41) than the Bulls in the game.

Senior **Louis Campbell** led Buffalo with 11 points and three assists, but Buffalo did not get another player into double figures. Leading scorer **Robert Brown** was held to nine points while battling flu symptoms and foul trouble. Foster added eight points and five rebounds for Buffalo.

The 42 points was the lowest output the Bulls have had in a game since they lost to Iowa State, 106-36, to open the 1992-93 season.

### RECAP

**KALAMAZOO, MI** – Western Michigan University, who had been struggling from the field most of the season, found their shooting eye just in time for the University at Buffalo's visit to University Arena.

The result was a 56% shooting night by the Broncos and the eighth straight loss for Buffalo as Western Michigan used a huge first half to post a 90-72 victory in Mid-American Conference play. The Broncos hit 18-of-32 shots (56.3%) in the first half to open up a 46-24 halftime lead. Little-used forward Pat Cleland had all 11 of his points in the first half as WMU hit on eight three-pointers in the first half.

The Bulls trailed 10-4 when forward **Robert Brown** – who finished with 14 points – picked up his second foul. With UB already short on post players, the Broncos slowly started to pull away, opening up the large halftime lead. The Bulls trailed, 27-17 with 8:10 remaining but the Broncos closed the half with a 19-7 run.

The Broncos eventually pulled out to a 33-point lead (61-28) early in the second half before Buffalo used a ferocious full-court press to make things interesting. Behind the scoring of **Louis Campbell** and **Jason Robinson** – who combined for 25 second half points – the Bulls would cut the lead to 69-53 with 8:30 left in the game.

Campbell's 23 points matched his season high on the year and the senior also led the Bulls with eight rebounds, four assists and three steals. The Bulls could get no closer than 16 points, however, as fatigue caught up late in the game and the Broncos continued their torrid shooting from the field and the foul line (17-of-20).

Buffalo, which shot a season-high 40 free throws, was hurt by 15 misses at the charity stripe and were outrebounded 40-33. Robinson added 16 points and five rebounds for Buffalo and hit 5-of-8 shots from the field.
